- Appointment of John Hayes as Minister responsible for careers guidance across DfE and BIS

- Tighter constraints on spending expected CSR outcome later this month
- Still much to decide and discussions with Ministers continuing

 - quality and professionalism of careers guidance
 - use of objective, empirical data to support guidance
